Introduction

UMAP Discovery Camp 2023: The Globe (Global Bound & Exchange) Discover Indonesia is a joint program collaboration between Institut Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember (ITS) Surabaya & Universitas Islam Sultan Agung (UNISSULA) Semarang. The program will be held on **5** – **17 February 2023** in Surabaya & Semarang, Indonesia. The program aims to provide UMAP students the insight about Indonesia through exploration of Surabaya city and Semarang city. The participants would have insight and experience related to technology development in society, city development, culture, art, food, and society interaction.

ITS will expose participants to the implementation of SDGs 4-8-10-11-17 in Surabaya City, particularly City Council for Population Administration and Civil Registration, City Office for Education, and City Office for Cooperation and Micro Enterprises. The program will provide SDGs related courses, site visit to the government offices, case studies, and project. The use of technology in achieving sustainability post pandemic will be the highlight. In addition, participants will be given opportunities to learn Indonesian traditional instruments and martial arts.

Unissula will provide seminar on SDGs 4-5-11-16 in the context of Semarang City, particularly related to Semarang as a peaceful multi-religion city, resilient city and community, and the role of women as front liners against pandemic. In addition, participants will be provided with basic Indonesian language class, batik shirt making, and traditional dancing course. The joint program between ITS in East Java and Unissula in Central Java will definitely offer a great opportunity for participants to discover Indonesia through this program.



Host Institutions:

1. Institut Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember (ITS) Surabaya



Institut Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember (ITS) is a leading university in the field of science and technology in Indonesia. Established in 1960 in Surabaya, Indonesia, ITS aims to become a world-class university contributing to the independence of the nation and becoming a reference in education, research and community service, as well as the development of innovation, especially those that support the industry and the maritime sector.

ITS Surabaya is currently organized into seven faculties, i.e. Faculty of Science and Data Analytics, Faculty of Industrial Technology and Systems Engineering, Faculty of Civil, Planning, and Geo Engineering, Faculty of Marine Technology, Faculty of Intelligent Electrical and Informatics Technology, Faculty of Creative Design and Digital Business, and the Vocational Faculty. The seven faculties cover 33 undergraduate programs, six vocational study programs, 20 master programs, 15 doctoral programs, and 20 International Undergraduate Programs (IUP). ITS has seven study programs with international accreditation (IABEE and ABET) and 16 study programs with the AUN-QA international certification. ITS has international partners involving more than 360 partner institutions in 52 countries.

It is home to more than 1,000 faculty members and over 14,000 undergraduate and graduate students. ITS's current areas of research include manufacturing, transportation, and logistics, sustainable energy, artificial intelligence and biomedical technology, advanced materials and nanotechnology, internet of things and defense technology, agri-food and biotechnology, climate change and disaster, maritime science and technology, fundamental sciences, and infrastructure and sustainable environment. ITS has a Science Techno Park with centers in automotive, maritime technology, ICT and robotics, and creative design.





2. Universitas Islam Sultan Agung (UNISSULA) Semarang

Universitas Islam Sultan Agung (UNISSULA) is an Islamic private university located in the vibrant city of Semarang, the heart of Central Java province. It was established in May 20th, 1962 by Sultan Agung Waqf Foundation. UNISSULA was named after Sultan Agung, a national hero of Indonesia who ruled Mataram Sultanate from 1613 to 1645. With long tradition of providing excellent education, UNISSULA keeps nurturing its solid values; Islamic, Green, Eco, and Smart. This values shape its activities in the field of Education, Research, and Community Service in the national as well as international level.

UNISSULA currently offers 22 undergraduate programs, 7 master programs, and 3 doctoral programs. Those programs are hosted by 11 faculties/schools namely; (1) Faculty of Economics, (2) Faculty of Law, (3) Faculty of Islamic Studies, (4) Faculty of Engineering, (5) Faculty of Industrial Technology, (6) Faculty of Teacher Training and Education, (7) Faculty of Languages and Communication Science, (8) Faculty of Medicine, (9) Faculty of Nursing Science, (10) Faculty of Dentistry, and (11) Faculty of Psychology. In the institutional level, UNISSULA already achieved the highest accreditation status as "**UNGGUL/EXCELLENT**" by the National Accreditation Board of Indonesian Higher Education. Some of its departments has also accredited internationally by ASICS (London) and ABEST 21 (Japan).

In the area of internationalization, UNISSULA commits to expand its global partners and networks to explore more international activities for its students. With an abundance of possibility to join international activities, it is hoped that UNISSULA's student and graduates could possess intercultural competence and global collaboration to solve the future challenges.


Please be well-informed with above agenda as well as the following points:

- The committee only provide the accommodation from 5 Feb 2023 until 17 Feb 2023. If you wish to arrive before the suggested date or to extend your stay, please kindly let us know and the expenses would be borne by each participant.
- The committee will provide bus transportation from Surabaya to Semarang
- Please make sure that you need to arrive at Juanda International Airport Surabaya. However, you may choose to depart from Semarang or Surabaya.



Arrival & Departure

Participants are strongly advised to arrive in Juanda International Airport, Surabaya. Juanda International Airport (Indonesian: Bandara Udara Internasional Juanda) is an international airport located in <u>Sidoarjo</u>, a neighbor city near <u>Surabaya</u>, <u>East Java</u>. It is located approximately 20 km from city center of Surabaya. If there is no direct flight to Juanda International Airport from your country, you may transit first at Soekarno-Hatta International Airport, Cengkareng, Jakarta or Ngurah Rai International Airport, Denpasar, Bali. Then, you could take domestic flight from Jakarta or Denpasar to Surabaya.



There are two airport terminals in Juanda International Airport, Terminal 1 and Terminal 2. They are located near to each other but different location for the entrance. If you take international flight to Surabaya, you will land at Terminal 2, but if you take domestic flight to Surabaya, you will probably land at Terminal 1.



Please arrive in Surabaya on 5 Feb 2023. However, you may choose between Surabaya or Semarang for your departure. Please make sure that you need to check out in Semarang on 17 Feb 2023. You should not worry about your access to the lodging, because we provide all accommodation including pick up service at airport. Please make sure to confirm your arrival details to us.

Facilities & Benefit

All students from UMAP members (except Indonesian nationality) could register in this program through USCO in UMAP website and nomination from the home university is mandatory. The program fee is waived for all selected students. However, you need to be responsible with your return flight ticket, dinner, visa fees (if any), travel insurance and other personal expenses. During the program, all participants will stay in Campus Guest House and Hotel. The committee also provide pick up arrangement on Feb 5 in Surabaya and drop off service on Feb 17 in Semarang. The participants who completed the program are entitled to receive certificate of participation from ITS & UNISSULA.

Financial Information

During this program, you should also bring extra money. Indonesia mainly accept Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) as payment. Should you have to exchange money after your arrival, you may also need to bring money in US Dollar (USD). In Surabaya and Semarang, many big shops accept visa and master card for payment.

Rough estimation for daily needs are:

Mineral Water 600ml	: Rp 4,000.00 per Bottle
Snacks	: Rp 5,000.00 – Rp 20,000.00 each
Toiletries	: RP 15,000.00 – RP 30,000.00 each
Sim Card	: Rp 50,000.00 – Rp.100,000.00 each

Climate and Weather

Indonesia is a tropical country with 2 seasons only. The humidity level is high, especially during December to March. We suggest you to bring umbrella or a raincoat along. Surabaya and Semarang is also known for its hot temperature up to 36° Celcius. When it rains, the temperature drops into around $23^{\circ} - 25^{\circ}$ Celcius.

Outfit

Appropriate clothing during the program consists of common appropriate working outfit including collar shirt, blouse over full-length jeans and trousers and a pair of shoes. **Please make sure that you wear collared outfit in formal session during this program** due to our regulation in our universities. During rainy season, a jumper/sweater/pullover or sweat shirt will be sufficient. You may not need to bring too many personal items for your necessities in Indonesia. ITS and Unissula are located near malls and shopping centers which provide daily needs, clothing and electronics equipment. Please use decent cloth and pants (no vulgar cloth and hot pan).

Visa Arrangement & Arrival Info

As per stated 6 April 2022, International Visitor from nine ASEAN countries can enter Indonesia with visa-free visits, while students from 43 countries are currently allowed to apply Visa on Arrival (VoA) for 30 days-length stay in Indonesia. The fee for getting the VoA is IDR 500.000 and you may arrange this visa at the arrival's airport. **The immigration will ask you to show your return ticket in order to get VoA/ASEAN Free Visa. The visa fees could only be paid in IDR currency. So we suggest to prepare IDR from your country in cash.**

Vietnam. **Students from countries that are not listed above, must apply online visa through ITS at least 3 weeks before the arrival date. The fees for this visa is IDR 2.000.000,-**

As per 18 July 2022, Indonesia has renew the entry regulation to enter Indonesia. International visitor can enter Indonesia without quarantine and without show PCR, need to prepare the following documents:

- 3rd doze of Vaccination certificate (print out and digital). Please kindly provide the certificate in english and your origin language for print out certificate of vaccination. However you need to input your digital certificate first to our Government website at least 10 days before your arrival. Please kindly go to this website and upload all your certificate vaccination here → https://vaksinln.dto.kemkes.go.id/sign/in
- If you had got Covid-19 positive, please kindly provide recovery letter who can show that you already recovery from Covid-19 at least 30 Days before your arrival.
- Please download the application of "Pedulilindungi" from playstore and please kindly fill P a g



at e-hac section in before your arrival in Indonesia. We will conduct zoom meeting and also create Whatsapp group to assist you for this matter.

- If you have special case that you do not receive vaccination, you need to show a letter from Government Hospital/Public Hospital about your situation.



Regarding the Covid protocols in the airport, there are two schemes that you need to be aware of:

- 1. After the temperature is checked, for those who does not have Covid-19 symptoms and below 37,5 Celcius, the officer will only ask for your documents, and they will allow you to continue your journey.
- 2. If your body temperature is higher than 37,5 Celcius. Here are the steps that you need to follow:
 - You need to take PCR Test in the Airport in Indonesia
 - You need to wait in a hotel at least one day until you got negative result test. However, you need to pay the Hotel & PCR Test by your own.

Due to the condition above, we would like to suggest for participants who transit/change plan in Jakarta/Denpasar-Bali, to prepare minimum 3 hours different until your next flight to Surabaya.
